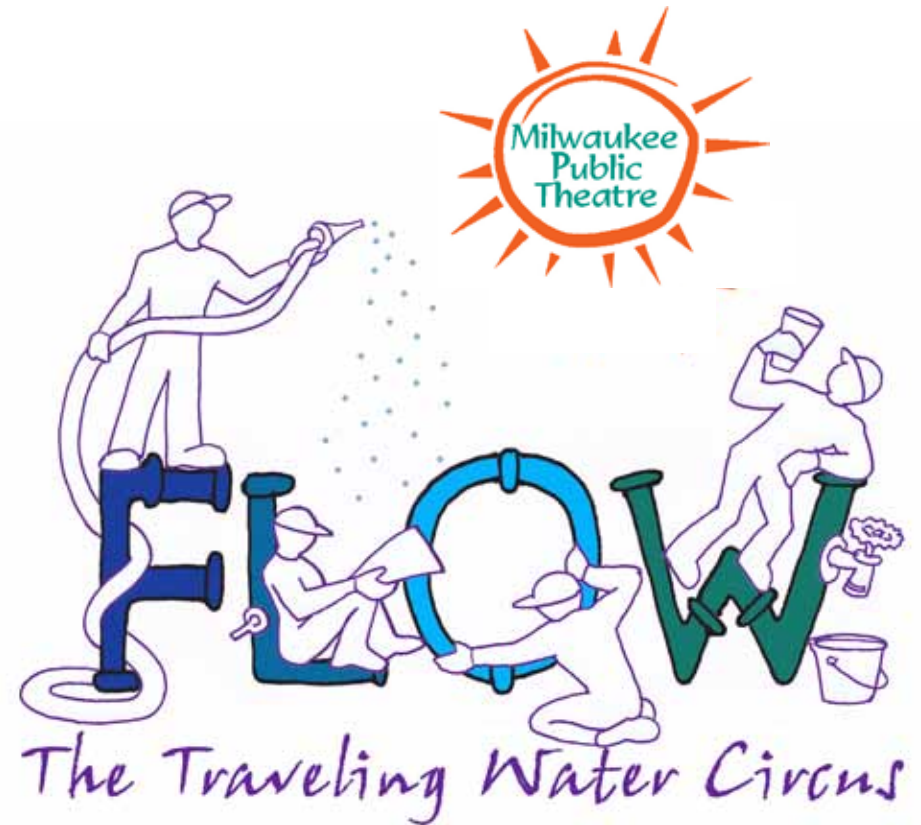

Now celebrating its 37th season, Milwaukee Public Theatre has created hundreds of original stage works since 1974 including ten which address environmental issues. With **FLOW: The Traveling Water Circus**, MPT adds an eleventh environmental show which incorporates the company's trademark circus skills and highly visual, musical and kinetic theatrics.

FLOW was imagined as a way to engage young minds and hearts about an issue that will command more attention and economic investment as the next generation and those that follow experience the impact of an increasing world population and the need to share a finite global fresh water supply. In Wisconsin, we live in a water-rich region, but Great Lakes communities, educators, environmentalists, and water industry experts now acknowledge that we take this precious commodity for granted. The demand for clean, fresh water and the need for businesses, technologies and a workforce trained in water management will only increase.

Working with information gathered from Milwaukee Water Council corporate, educational and agency members, Veolia Water, the Milwaukee City Water Works, MPS and national water advocacy groups and educators, **FLOW** condenses a huge amount of facts, figures and career concepts into a lively and, we hope, memorable 55 minute production. Conceived as a way to display the considerable skills of a talented cast, **FLOW** features four water-loving characters who discover where their fresh water comes from, how it's used and wasted, and what they can do to preserve this life-sustaining resource. Simply put, there are simple actions that all of us can take every day to practice wise water use.
